## A Message from one of our Ministers



Dear friends,

### Where is Jesus?

Where are we to see Christ at work?

From the Arians in the 4<sup>th</sup> century to the Deists in the 18<sup>th</sup> century to the "God is dead" movement of the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century, there have always been some folks around the Church who struggle to see how God could take any active role in the goings-on of the world. Indeed, even within the Church itself there is a strong line of thought that the Church is merely a memorial society: Jesus left us a long time ago so we gather weekly to remember him and his teachings and then go out to try and do the sort of things that He can't do – because He's no longer here.

Maybe it's because God is Spirit and we are no longer trained to "see" spiritual things, or maybe it's just that we've forgotten how to ask the right questions or look in the right places. Whatever the reasons, it's often hard to translate our credal belief – that at the Ascension Jesus took the power to reign and since Pentecost He continues His mission among us in the power of His Spirit – into recognising Jesus at work here or there. Yet, as Gerard Manley Hopkins reminds us in his sonnet *As Kingfishers Catch Fire*, "Christ plays in ten thousand places, Lovely in limbs, and lovely in eyes not his."

It's easy to see if you know where to look. Do this now: Assume for a moment God is in the world and at work in your life. Think about a situation that is troubling you or causing you pain. Now ask yourself "The God Question": "What is God doing in this situation?" It may take some practice and it helps to know what God is like – which we discover by studying Scripture – but, if we look and ask, we will start to see God at work bringing comfort, healing and transformation.

The first three months of our union has been a frantic time. So many systems to put in place. So many new ways of doing things. So many new people to get to know. So many expectations — and fears. It's been hard for me to ask any questions other than "What's next?" But when I pause to ask "The God Question": "What is God doing in our new union of

churches?", a glorious landscape of grace opens up before my eyes: energetic volunteers working round the clock to get our finance, IT, pastoral and outreach systems "talking" to one another; congregations welcoming Euan, Tose and me wherever we go; parish-wide prayers being offered regularly for Sheila as we wait and watch eagerly for her healing; local lay people stepping up to make sure worship continues on Sundays when a minister isn't present; Hope Café, Thursday Drop-in and Loaves & Fishes creating spaces for fellowship; members supporting fund-raisers across former parish boundaries; friends offering friends lifts to joint services; and, oh, the joint services themselves!, celebrations of life and community.

Don't get me wrong, we are far from having all the details of the new union pinned down. I have probably never felt less "in control" of all that is happening in the church. But when I see all that God is doing in you and among you and through you – the members of Bennachie Parish Church – my heart sings! What a joy to be part of this ministry team! What a joy to be one of your ministers!

#### Bennachie Parish Kirk Session

And so it begins. We are all now part of a new greatly enlarged parish with all the problems, worries and work associated with this major change. But such excitement too! Because of the many pressures of reduced finances and workforce, the Church of Scotland decided that churches throughout Scotland should form new groupings, and that sadly some churches would close. In our area, this meant that Cluny Church, Midmar and Blairdaff would close and the buildings sold. The parishes of these churches are now to be supported by the remaining churches, that is Chapel of Garioch, Monymusk, Kintore, Echt and Kemnay.

It is never easy to accept such major changes; new people to get to know and to work with, but new opportunities for development of our local ministry as well as ourselves. Familiar faces crop up, but also new faces, even new members.

There is no doubt there is confusion about what is going on, when and by whom. We are trying hard to communicate with church members and the community. A website is being developed for the new Church, although the original church websites will still exist. This newsletter is an example of our efforts. We have a Team ministry with Neil Meyer, Euan Glen and Sheila Mitchell. Sadly, Sheila has been ill, and has been away from her ministry. We miss her contribution and wish her a speedy recovery. We so depend on each other.

Along with Stella Gauld from Blairdaff and Chapel of Garioch as the deputy, I took on the challenge of being Session Clerk to the new Kirk Session of Bennachie Parish Church. I bless the assistance of Stuart in the Church Office, as well as the ministers who respond so kindly to my queries. A major task is finding out who is who, and importantly how to contact them. Shared knowledge and shared resources will be beneficial to all of us in the care for our parish, property management, our social events and money management to name but a few.

More than 70 elders took part in the original kirk sessions. Not all these folk will now attend Bennachie Parish Session, but they are still busy in their local leadership teams. The management of the many aspects of Bennachie Parish church life is a work in progress, but we look forward to a new and enthusiastic time together.

## **Cluny and Monymusk Local Leadership Team**

This team has held its first meeting at which we agreed on the responsibilities we now have to our former members and to the Kirk Session and the Committees of Bennachie Parish Church. We are committed and enthusiastic about putting these into practice as far as we are able with our limited numbers.

Our first priority is to develop the capability and quality of our audio-visual equipment so that we are able to make full use of technology in Monymusk Church.

Discussion then took place planning for our annual Christmas services and events in Cluny and Monymusk Churches.

**On Sunday 17**<sup>th</sup> **December** at Cluny Church at 10am our Locally Led Christmas Family Nativity Service is a new departure. The service will be led by adult readers, younger members of the congregation and musicians. Allan Bickett to play the organ. A Party Tea in the hall will follow the service.

**On Tuesday 19**<sup>th</sup> **December** players from the Bon Accord Silver Band join us to play Christmas Carols around the tree in Monymusk Square at 7pm. Come warmly dressed and ready to sing! Refreshments are on sale from 6.30 pm. There will be a collection for the Cyrenians.

Rev Euan Glen will lead Family Services in Monymusk Church at **7pm** on Christmas Eve and **10:30** on Christmas Morning.

A very warm welcome awaits you at all of the above.

## The Church is Out There

Littlewood Court, Station Road, in Kemnay, is a retirement housing complex run by Aberdeenshire Council. It has thirty-two flats across two levels, with lift access, a communal lounge, a library and gardens. Each flat is provided with gas central heating, double glazing and a fitted kitchen. A door entry system provides security, and all properties are connected to the Community Alarm Service. A comfortable place to live.

Activities vary from fish and chip nights, bingo, dominoes, craft clubs and

concerts...and plenty of opportunity to make friends.

Kemnay Kirk has sixteen members who reside here, and regular elder visits help to maintain contact for those who cannot come to the services. Using current technology, church services are live streamed and enable folk to feel part of Sunday worship in the comfort of the Littlewood Court lounge. Visiting elders can serve communion.

Life does not stop when one retires or needs help in one's home. We hope to provide insights into the past and present lives of the residents in this newsletter as time goes on. Watch this space!



## **Update from Chapel of Garioch**



Bennachie Parish Church union is certainly showing the signs of working together. A plea from Chapel of Garioch church to change a lightbulb at height led to the offer of a scaffolding platform from folks at Kemnay and the job was duly carried out successfully.

The creation of a Café seating area has long been mooted at Chapel of

Garioch (CoG) church. Currently, fellowship is held with folks standing in the aisles between the pews. It has been considered that the removal of the pews under the balcony where the tea serving currently is to create a seating area and café for the fellowship after a service would be welcomed. Mentioning this at the Session meeting has now led to offers of the expertise and sharing of experiences from Echt Church folks as their renovation is still relatively new.

I'm sure everyone has heard of the growing of Topsy, growing without planning or design. We trust that with some hard thinking, we will ensure that the project is very well controlled, and that changes can be made sensitively within the building, whilst also looking to future proof it.

The cafe seating area will require a heating rethink as the pew removal will leave exposed pipes which will need to be moved. Some of the other pipes within the church are currently leaking; the repairs to the pipes have been

going on for some years as this is an old system which is incredibly inefficient. I'm sure that CoG is one of the few churches which offers blankets along with the Order of Service on a Sunday in winter! The start of looking at a café may require the review of all the heating. The café will also require drainage and hot water heating, as it currently only has an incoming cold water tap, but no sink.

Of course, if we start to review the whole heating system and removal of pews in one area, then it makes sense to wonder if it is cost effective and practical if all the pews should be lifted out to be replaced with moveable seating. This would allow for a full review of the existing heating, even consider underfloor heating, which was the best option for Echt.

This change would also mean that the church internal space could be used as a community space too, not just for Sundays, but for other groups in the Parish too, encouraging familiarity with the church, as well as other church activities for our own use currently not possible with the pews in place.

If there is to be disruption to the fabric of the church, this would also be a great opportunity to have an upgrade to the crackly sound system and think about the Audio Visual items needed to standardise across the buildings in Bennachie Parish Church so that Sunday services can be accommodated to be streamed in or out according to requirements, with hymns on screens and not books, etc. The microphone currently interferes with the speakers, meaning that a loud singing minister cuts out the music!

Of course, this is just the very early stages of the discussions. If anyone else has expertise in the areas of plumbing, electrical work, heating and AV, who can help prepare the groundwork in a project plan to allow the Session to make informed decisions in due course, please do contact me. We will have a kick-off meeting in December to start the ball rolling.

#### Zimbabwe 1986

The year is 1986, six years after Zimbabwe independence from Britain when parents brought me to this earth and named me Tiritose which was later shortened to Tose which means Together in English. I was born in a polygamous family of fifteen children and me being the second from last. I am married to Sheanesu and we have three children.

It was in April 2003 when I gave my life to Jesus as my lord and saviour. Eight years later while I was working at Air Zimbabwe as a baggage handler, I felt that the Lord was calling me to do full time ministry. It was a tough decision to take but it was like fire kept in my bones such that I could not resist the call of the Lord.

In 2012 I enrolled at Murray Theological College and trained for 4 years for a diploma in theology. Later, I did my degree in Theology and masters in Theology and Sustainable Development.

I was then ordained in 2016 as a minister of word and sacrament and served in two Parishes: Mandara Congregation 2016-2018, then Zvishavane Congregation 2019-2021, before I moved to Scotland to serve in the Church of Scotland as a minister in August 2021.

In my last Parish in Zvishavane I was a minister of over 400 active members with four worship centres. Sunday school had over 100 children. It was great pleasure to work in Zimbabwe as I gained experience of preaching, counselling, and in administering of Sacraments.

The Reformed Church in Zimbabwe was formed in 1901 and the Scottish missionaries played a pivotal role in its foundation. It happened that during my theological training, I was taught by Rev Henry Murray who was a grand son of one of the Scottish Missionaries who came to Zimbabwe in 1913. Henry Murray played a pivotal role in my decision to finally come to Scotland. He used to say: "We came here to preach the word of God as

Missionaries and we left the comfort of our homes in Scotland. So whenever God calls you to minster overseas, accept it, because God's grace will always follow you" When the opportunity to come and serve in the Church of Scotland arose, Henry Murray's words became vivid in my mind.

Finally, I am here in Bennachie Parish doing God's work as an answer to His call.

## The Hope Cafe at Echt Church Tuesday mornings 9 till 11

The Covid pandemic saw the end of our Tiny Tots Group and also the Seniors' Friendship Club, and we wondered what we could do to replace them.

The church had been refurbished just before lockdown and the pews removed, so we have plenty of useable space in the church.

We wanted to encourage everyone to come, so thought a 9am start would encourage mums who had taken their children to school. There would be a play corner for any small children who came.



It was hoped that previous members of the Friendship Club might want to have somewhere to meet and chat. We wanted to include all generations. To keep the catering simple we decided to serve toast with tea or coffee. We also have shortbread made by one of our helpers. We would suggest a donation of £2.

And so the Hope Cafe began on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Thanks to my wonderful group of volunteer helpers, it has been a great success, with 20-30 adults attending each week as well as babies and small children.

So far our proceeds have twinned a toilet in Sudan, helped the Turkish earthquake appeal, and we have given a donation to Rev Tose Shayamunda to help pay for education for the children of his home village in Zimbabwe. We plan to give regular contributions to help Tose's work to improve the lives of the people in his village.

Fridays 1-3



### **Editor's Testimony**

I was born in Leicestershire in a market town called Melton Mowbray, famous for its pork pies. I was baptised as an infant in St Mary's Church. I was the eldest of four children I attended church regularly along with my sister and two brothers in line with my Dad's wishes. Also Sunday school at the Blakney institute which was just across the road from the church.

In my early teens I remember learning the Apostles Creed whilst on my paper round, in preparation for my confirmation ceremony. I must have learned it as I was then confirmed at St Mary's Church.

In my teens it was all hands to the pump helping my parents build their dream home carrying bricks up ladders and operating a cement mixer amongst other things. I spent my free time making Airfix kits, go karts and flying model planes. On leaving school, I decided to study engineering, so I signed up for a National Diploma in Technology. I came out with a commendation and was fortunate in gaining sponsorship from BP Oil to complete a four-year BTech sandwich course in Mechanical Engineering at Loughborough University. My last period of industrial training on the course was a period of six months in Aberdeen mostly spent offshore on a drilling rig.

Having left home to attend university my studies took over attending church, however a seed had been planted.

On gaining my degree I took up a job with BP Exploration moving to Aberdeen. I completed a two-year graduate training programme which included time spent offshore on platforms and diving vessels in the Forties oilfield, before settling into my chosen field as a Subsea Engineer. At which point I was fortunate to meet Diane and we married in Aberdeen in 1982.

Around this time, I began to have a lot of physical challenges in my job due to my condition, after tests at Aberdeen Royal Infirmary an inherited muscle wasting condition called Becker Muscular Dystrophy (BMD) was formally diagnosed. My career with BP and latterly with Apache North Sea took a different path but I enjoyed a very interesting career, latterly as a Verification Engineer thanks to the training I had received.

After our son was born in 1987, I started attending St Columba's Church in the Bridge of Don in Aberdeen on a regular basis. He and Diane were baptised together. A few years later we moved to Kemnay and I became an Elder at Kemnay Parish Church of Scotland and latterly editor of the

Kemnay Kirk newsletter.

There is currently no cure for BMD. I was fortunate that the condition had little effect in my life until my mid-twenties when my physical strength started to deteriorate very slowly. I have tried to live a normal a life as possible adapting to different circumstances as my condition worsened.

In 1994 Diane saw an advert on TV about Flying Scholarships for the disabled a legacy of Sir Douglas Bader. She sent off and received the application forms without my knowledge, they were put past due to Christmas holidays and nearly forgotten. I completed my application just in time to meet the deadline and a neurologist (the husband of someone we knew in the church) was able to confirm my fitness to learn to fly. After a selection process at RAF Cranwell, I was fortunate to win a scholarship. From over 200 applications 20 were awarded and two winners came from Aberdeen myself and a now close friend. Four of us decided to take up our scholarships together in 1995 and we spent six weeks in Atlanta, Georgia learning to fly. I didn't manage to obtain my wings but flew solo. The instructor I was paired with was a Christian man and we still keep in touch.

Guess what, the close friend I mentioned invited Diane over to her Spanish villa one weekend which led us to buy a property in the same area of Spain.

I have never had a blinding light moment during my life but I believe the Holy Spirit has motivated me, guided me and helped me all through my life. I have recently returned to my boyhood hobby and I am enjoying the challenge of learning to fly a radio control model aeroplane. The concentration required to fly a model plane helps me to forget my disability.

My faith has enabled me to pass worries, over which I have no control, to the Lord's care. I have also been blessed to have good health in general, a very loving and supportive wife who is also a brilliant carer, my son and very supportive friends who have helped me along the journey.

For quite some time Diane and I have been prayerfully considering our Christian journey in relation to Christian Baptism and being "Born Again". Full immersion baptisms are carried out on a regular basis at the Christian Fellowship Church we attend when we are in Spain, known as Salt Church Los Montesinos which is a member of the Federation of Assemblies of God. This has been a great inspiration to us but the practicalities of this in my case have weighed heavily on our minds. We felt that even in a warm

climate, full immersion baptism was not practicable or safe for me although there have been many interesting conversations as to how this might be achieved.

Following discussion with Joshua, our ex Church of Scotland minister we decided to have a joint baptism reaffirmation. This took place in Kemnay Church on Sunday 16 July 2023, it was a very memorable occasion and it boosted our commitment to the Lord. This was a 'sprinkled' rather than a full immersion baptism.

On returning to Spain, we hoped to achieve our goal of becoming associate members of Salt Church, but we found that a full immersion baptism is required to achieve this. Our pastor Chris and his wife Helena kindly came and spent time with us and through a very fruitful discussion a way forward came to light.

I had a full immersion baptism on 18 November 2023 in the wet room of our Spanish home! Diane had a full immersion baptism in a swimming pool the next day.

We feel that we are now moving forward from the same point as we continue our individual Christian journeys on the narrow path and that the Holy Spirit has guided us through the decision process.

For myself the following bible verse is now embedded in my heart:

'So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.' — Isaiah 41:10 NIV


